The Southern Pacific began its march out of the Bay Area in March of 1869 when it opened an extension 30 miles south of San Jose to Gilroy. Beyond, it passed through the San Joaquin Valley reaching Modesto (November, 1870), Fresno (May, 1872), and Bakersfield (November, 1874) before dispatching its first train to Los Angeles (then a town of less than

10,000 residents) on September 5, 1876.

Southern Pacific In The Bay

Drawbridge (formerly Saline City) is a ghost town with an abandoned railroad station located at the southern end of the San Francisco Bay on Station Island, now a part of the city of Fremont, California, United States. It is located on the Union Pacific Railroad 6 miles (10 km) south of downtown Fremont, at an elevation of 7 feet (2 m). Formerly used as a hunting village, it has been a ghost

Southern Pacific-Golden Gate auto ferries ceased operation shortly after the San Francisco–Oakland Bay Bridge and Golden Gate Bridge opened. A few of the larger ferries were purchased by the Richmond-San Rafael Ferry Company to shuttle automobiles between Richmond and San Rafael , but most were sold for use in Puget Sound.

Southern Pacific's "San Joaquin Daylight" awaits departure from Oakland's East Bay Pier/Ferry Slip (also known as the "Mole") during the early 1950s. The SP steam engine will carry the train southbound via the San Joaquin Valley via Fresno to Los Angeles. Four tracks and a carriageway were provided for over the first 4,860 feet.

It also served as a port for Southern Pacific railroad ferries. This port, or "Mole", was served by local trolley cars, railroad ferries to San Francisco, and local steam commuter lines of both Central Pacific and Southern Pacific. Upon completion of the Bay Bridge, the Alameda Mole was no longer necessary.
